If coming from Stratford International station, when exiting, follow signs for the Olympic Park. Once you're out the station search for "UCL East Marshgate" on your phone navigation or ask for directions to towards the London Stadium to find us.

UCL East is made up of two buildings:



2. Accessibility & Fire Safety

The UCL East campus, including the student accommodation at One Pool Street, have been designed to be fully accessible. The Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park is car-free, but there are Blue Badge disabled parking facilities and drop-off points on the campus. Accessible parking can be arranged - please email us at ucleast@ucl.ac.uk.

Fire assembly - The fire assembly point for UCLE is to the south of the Marshgate building on the open land.

3. About the location

Our new campus is on [Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park](#) at East Bank in Stratford in east London. [East Bank](#) is the UK's newest culture and innovation quarter, backed by the Mayor of London and a legacy of the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games. UCL is a founding partner in East Bank, along with other global institutions like the BBC, V&A, Sadler's Wells and London College of Fashion, UAL.

4. Opening hours - campus buildings

Both **One Pool Street and Marshgate buildings** are open **between 9am to 6pm**.

- For Marshgate - this includes the atrium, first floor, café and toilets
- For One Pool Street - this includes the atrium, first floor, second floor, café and toilet facilities.
- From Monday to Friday during core hours, a receptionist will be able to assist you.
- Out of hours, reception is staffed by a member of the security team.

5. Opening hours - cafés, refectory, library, study and exhibition spaces

Opening times may vary.

Open to staff, students and members of the public:

- **Marshgate Café** - open **from 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday**. It can be accessed externally or from the ground floor of Marshgate.
- **Marshgate Refectory** - Cafe area **9.00 to 4 pm** / refectory **8 to 4 pm**
- **Pool Street Café** - open **from 8.00am to 4.30pm Monday to Friday** It can be accessed externally or from the ground floor of One Pool Street.
- **Urban Room** - open from **10.00am - 6.00pm Monday to Saturday**. It can be accessed from the ground floor of One Pool Street.
- **Culture Lab** - open to the public on **Wednesdays at 2.00 - 5.00pm, the first Saturday of each month, or by appointment**. Accessible by signing in at Marshgate reception.
- **First Floor Galleries**, Marshgate - **open 10.00am - 6.00pm Monday - Friday**. It can be accessed externally or from the ground floor of Marshgate.

6. Codes of Conduct

We ask all those visiting any of our UCL campuses to abide by our [Code of Conduct for Visitors](#) and UCL students are required to abide by our [Code of Conduct for Students](#).

The Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park is a public park and as such there are byelaws (local laws) that apply to all users of the Park, including our campus and all other areas on the park. 
Accessible parking and cycle racks

Our UCL East campus is predominantly car-free. However, there is a drop-off point and a number of disabled parking bays nearby. Accessible parking spaces can be reserved on site. There is secure cycle storage for students and staff as well as bicycle racks for the public to use.

8. Detailed information on transport connections

UCL East is in the Olympic Park, this location is a 20-minute tube to Central London, (Liverpool Street and Tottenham Court Road) via the Elisabeth Line.



1. London Underground Tube

Stratford Station is the nearest Tube station to UCL East, served by the Central and Jubilee lines. From Stratford station, you can take a free shuttle bus to the campus, which runs approx. every 5 minutes, and the journey takes around 10 minutes. Alternatively, you can walk from Stratford station to UCL East in approximately 20 minutes. The Tube is a convenient and fast way to get to UCL East from anywhere in London and is especially useful if you're travelling from the West End or North London.

2. London Overground

Stratford and Stratford International train stations are nearby. Stratford station is also served by the Overground, DLR, and National Rail. The Overground is an excellent option if you're travelling from East or South London and is also well-connected to other transport networks such as the DLR and National Rail. 3. Bus

Several bus routes serve the area around UCL East. Bus routes 97, 108, 308, 339, and 425 all stop near the campus. You can also take the 388 buses from Blackfriars or Elephant & Castle to the campus, which runs every 8-10 minutes during peak hours.

4. Cycling

UCL East is easily accessible by bike, with a dedicated cycle route running through the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park, providing a safe and scenic route to the campus. There are also cycle racks available on campus for those who prefer to cycle, making it easy to park your bike when you arrive. 5. Car

Parking permit eligibility The Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park does not permit UCL to provide parking except for people with accessibility requirements. However, several public car parks are nearby, including the [Westfield Stratford City](#) car park and the [Stratford Multi-Storey Car Park](#). Be aware that parking in London can be expensive, so it's worth considering other transport options. Driving is a good option if you're travelling from further afield or have a lot of luggage to carry but be aware that traffic in East London can be heavy at peak times. You can also order a ride from several online apps, such as [Bolt](#), [Uber](#), etc.

Whatever your preferred method of transport, plan your journey in advance to make sure you choose the best option for you. You can visit the Transport for London website to plan your journey and download the [Citymapper](#) app on your phone to compare transport options, costs, and live departure times.
